

BE PREPARED FOR A LANDSLIDE

Landslides cause 25–50 deaths and more than a billion dollars in damage each year.

A landslide is rocks, earth, or other materials moving down a slope. A mud flow is a landslide that is combined with up to 60 percent water.



Can strike with little or no warning



Travel 55–100 miles per hour



Caused by rain, earthquakes, volcanoes, or changes to the land



Can result from flooding

IF YOU ARE UNDER A LANDSLIDE WARNING, FIND SAFE SHELTER RIGHT AWAY!

Evacuate early to avoid landslide risk.



Listen for emergency information and alerts.

Watch for signs of landslide.



Watch for flooding.
